Emmanuel Covid Standards - Effective February 2023

We are encouraged that more people are finding it comfortable to attend Sunday services. It is also understandable that everyone is making their own decisions that fit their own comfort levels. We are also aware that other virus infections including the flu are becoming more common and that they can be prevented by wearing masks, maintaining safe distance and by being vaccinated.

- 1. For worship services masks must continue to be worn. (The Minister, Lay Reader and Choir director, separated from others, and with special roles, are not requested to wear a mask.)
- 2. For other activities in the church, wearing of masks is recommended. Keeping a safe distance from others and getting vaccinated is also recommended.
- 3. For gatherings, either as part of Emmanuel activities or by outside groups, leaders of such gatherings should be aware of these standards and encourage wearing masks when it is practical.
- 4. Serving of food and drink in the church is acceptable and, of course, wearing a mask while eating and drinking cannot apply.
- 5. These standards also apply to the kitchen.
