Executive of Council Meeting: September 20, 2022

This was our first meeting of the new school year and Reverend Grant had the opportunity to hear a report from each Committee Chair and get a bit of flavour of the many activities that Emmanuel is involved in.

A motion was passed to extend Jeannie Page's license as Lay Worship Leader. (Thank you Jeannie for all you are doing for us.)

A motion was also passed to have Property and Grounds investigate having an electric vehicle charging station installed at the church. (Thank you, Bill, for adding this to the already onerous P and G work load.)

Committee Chair reports were discussed including transportation to the church for people unable to drive, status of building renovations, Social Action programs, youth programs, Chipembi activities, Take Time to Be Wholey, and Ministry and Personnel. Details are found in other parts of the Packet or please speak to Committee Chairs or Committee members for more background.

Covid Standards — effective October 2022. (No change from September)

The Emergency Planning Committee has updated Emmanuel's Covid standards effective for October.

We are encouraged that more people are finding it comfortable to attend church activities and Sunday services in person and enjoying the community feeling. It is also understandable that everyone is making their own decisions that fit their own comfort levels and staying home if they have Covid or flu symptoms. Standards for October:

- 1. For worship services (Sunday, Wednesday etc.) masks must continue to be worn.
- 2. For other activities in the church, wearing of masks is encouraged but not required.
- 3. For gatherings, either as part of Emmanuel activities or by outside groups, including activities in the kitchen, leaders of such gatherings can set mask standards applicable for their particular situation.

Church Office Build

The Church Office Build Project at the United Church of Zambia, Chipembi Congregation is in its final stages and completion of the project is scheduled for March 2023. There is still about \$6,000 Canadian to be funded by Emmanuel and Bells Corners United and it is our hope that the funding can be realized in order for them to keep to their timeline.

The Communion offering for Sunday, October 2, 2022 will be going to support the work and ministry of our partner church in Zambia, the United Church of Zambia, Chipembi Congregation. Your Communion Offering will provide funds which will allow the completion of their Church Office Build.

Pilgrimage to Chipembi in 2023

An invitation has been extended from the Chipembi Congregation to Emmanuel United and Bells Corners United to come to Chipembi for the dedication of the Church Office building. At

this point, they are suggesting March 2023, but they are also willing to work with us on a time that might work better for us.
