The Thursday Morning Discussion Group (Heretics) meets regularly at 10:00 a.m. on Thursdays on Zoom.


We are now discussing the book *Holy Envy: Finding God in the Faith of Others*, by Barbara Brown


This is what the CONTACT page looks like. Click on the dropdown list to select who you want to send your message to:



COUNCIL

The **November 21st** meeting will be a full meeting of Council, on Zoom, in order to allow a vote on Remit 1 and other matters requiring the presence of the full council. Thank you for planning to attend. Zoom details will be sent out as a reminder, by the Council Secretary closer to the date

Remit 1-Preparing to submit Emmanuel's Vote

In 2022, at General Council 44, the National Indigenous Council proposed that the church identify and remove any structural barriers that would prevent the development and sustaining of an autonomous National Indigenous Organization within The United Church of Canada. When any requested change in church structure will alter the Basis of Union of *The Manual*, as this will, a Category 3 Remit is required.

Approval of this remit will enable the creation of an autonomous National Indigenous Organization within The United Church of Canada.

This would acknowledge Indigenous peoples' rights to their own spiritual identities and to self-determination, and would be consistent with the Caretakers of our Indigenous Circle's document, *Calls to the Church*, and the *United Nation's Declaration on the rights of Indigenous Peoples*." ¹

Our own Regional Council, (EOORC) has submitted its "Yes" vote, but this is not enough. The *Emmanuel Council must vote* on **Remit 1** and submit its decision in writing by March 31, 2024. Abstentions or non-submissions are considered a vote against the remit. These resource pages are comprehensive and answer many questions already posed.

There have also been opportunities to attend information sessions either in person or online.

I attended an online session a few weeks ago and again, found that they covered the information available on the websites listed above.

A further related workshop, at Bells Corners United Church called, One River, Two Canoes went more in depth. Along with Rev. Grant, I participated in this two-day "deep dive" into the history of the Indigenous peoples in Canada. Two experts in both the history and the United Church, Rev. Dr. Teresa Burnett-Cole and Rev. Tony Snow, ensured that the presentation was interesting, insightful and deeply meaningful. The discussion around Remit 1 was fulsome. The strong desire for a "Yes" vote by the UCC evident; this is what the indigenous Church needs in order to move forward and they will no longer accept options that they have not either initiated or fully endorse. The image of having to come to the historic figure of an Indian Broker, to ask permission for anything, was used to exemplify that those involved will no longer behave in this way. Emmanuel's Council will meet specially in November to vote on Remit 1. If anyone has any strong objections to a "Yes" vote, please reach out to discuss them with the Council Chair before November 21st.
