

Christian meditation is a form of silent contemplative prayer. Simple, continuous, repetition of a mantra or prayer word leads us from the mind to the heart. Just Gifts Christmas Markets

A great big **THANK YOU** to everyone who contributed to making our *Just Gifts* Christmas Markets an overwhelming successes. Again this year we held both an on-line and in-person market, with the online market running from November 10th to the 25th and the in-person market (and on-line pick-up) on December 2nd. The excitement and "buzz" in the Sanctuary on Saturday, December 2, 2023 was something special.

In addition to raising awareness of Fair Trade and buying local, the events netted almost \$6,500 which will be split between our two partners with 50% directed to IBE in El Salvador, and 50% to the United Church of Zambia, Chipembi Congregation, our Zambia partner.

The "Pie Factory" – Betsi, Christine, Carol, Jean and friends - raised an additional \$4,200 for our Global Partners through the sale of over 500 pies (over and above those sold through the on-line and inperson markets) to members of the congregation and the larger community as well.
