

COUNCIL

On behalf of the 2024/25 Council, thank you for your trust and support in electing us to carry out the business of the Emmanuel congregation for the coming year. We are mindful that we are representative of you, the Congregation, and responsible to you.

Our first Council meeting was an in-person meeting held on Tuesday, March 19, 2024. Highlights of the meeting include:

- Approval of Social Action motion to transfer funds from the Social Action Heritage Fund to Isaruit Inuit Arts to support their Inuit games and gym program.
- Report on a new e-mail platform, Google Workspace for Non-profits, which should resolve problems the office has encountered with bulk e-mails and attachments and provide more efficiency.
- Suggestion for congregational self-assessment to look ahead at our future and sustainability initiated collection of data on trends and forecasts of revenues and expenses, attendance figures (both in-person and on-line), membership, etc.

All members of the congregation may attend meetings of Council and Executive of Council as observers. Our meetings are held on the third Tuesday of the month. Our next meeting with be a meeting of Executive of Council on Tuesday, April 16, 2024 at 7:00 pm on Zoom. Gift Cards for Good!

We all buy groceries. With gift cards for good you can help those who struggle to get enough groceries with your own buying. You can do it by using gift cards to pay for your groceries! Each gift card is

worth exactly what you spend for it, but 5% from that card goes to OMRA, our partner in providing affordable housing for immigrants. What an easy way to help! Last year OMRA received over \$1800 from the sale of gift cards. Cards may be purchased after church from Janice Peron and Joan Foster Jones on the 3rd Sunday each month. You choose: Loblaws, Farm Boy, or Metro. Usually for \$50 or \$100.

Janice takes cash or cheques. You can also pay by e-transfer if you order no later than the Friday before. E-transfers must be clearly marked for Grocery cards. Best to let Keith know too. *That's all there is to it! How can you refuse!*

Do you shop at Wilson's Independent Store on Alta Vista at



Bank? You can help the Heron Food Bank by saving your cash register receipts! Bring them to the church; we will collect them and the food bank receives 1% of the total you spent. What an easy way to help without costing you a penny! And that's not all- the OMRA grocery cards you buy at church are useful at that store too.

Remember to buy the grocery cards and save receipts- and you will be helping our neighbors who are struggling with food insecurity. Think of it -5% from the cards plus 1% = such a gift for the community!
