



WE ARE LOOKING FOR A BOOKKEEPER!

Mary Turnbull, Emmanuel's current bookkeeper, will be moving to Napanee at the end of August and, as such, we are looking for someone to fill the bookkeeper position.

The bookkeeper is responsible for recording financial transactions in our accounting software (QuickBooks), maintenance of the accounts, processing payments, checking for proper authorizations, assisting in distribution of cheques and completing monthly bank reconciliations. Knowledge of Quick Books is an asset, but not essential. We will help train you!

The bookkeeper is not responsible for administration of payroll, preparation of financial statements, GST/HST or other government filings (this is done by our Treasurer). We have a strong experienced Finance Committee to help you and our Treasurer, Lynn Solvason, works closely with the bookkeeper.

There is also a yearly honorarium paid to the bookkeeper of \$1,000.




