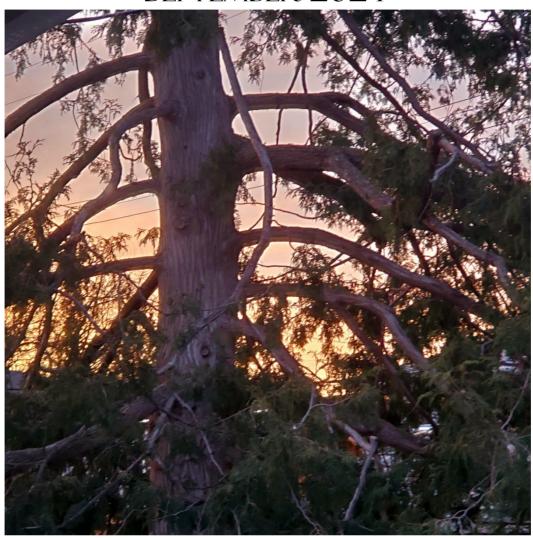

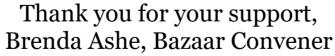
There will be many opportunities to contribute between now and November 9. The website, monthly packet and Sunday bulletin will keep you up-to-date with what's happening!

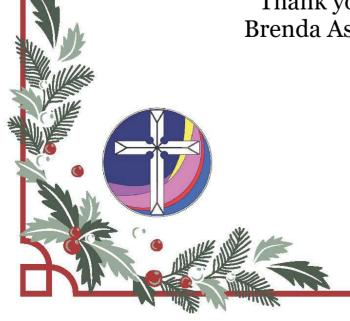
In the meantime, if you are canning or making jams this Fall, please consider setting aside a jar or two for the Bazaar.

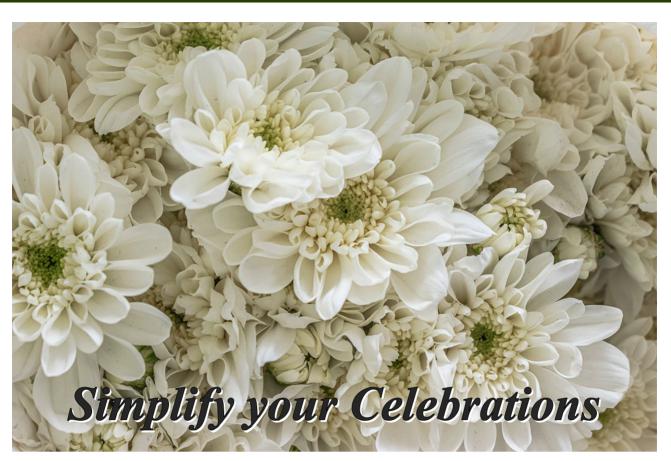
