

FALL STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN



The September Council meeting was an in-person meeting held on Tuesday, September 17, 2024.

Highlights:

- bequest received from the Estate of Ann Macleod (\$20,000) to be applied to the James R. Macleod Memorial Youth Fund
- additional bequest received from the Estate of Isobel Bryan (\$37,341.35) funds directed to the Legacy Fund (formerly Amalgamation Fund) consistent with the recommendations of the Ad Hoc Allocations Committee pertaining to the original bequest
- search process initiated for the position of Leader of Music Ministry - approval of the proposed Search Team and the 'Leader of Music Ministry Position Description'
 - transfer of \$4,000 from James R. Macleod Memorial Youth Fund to the CD Camp Fund to fund youth activities

• Social Action Committee (SAC) starting process of assisting Russell Heights Community House to obtain charitable status. SAC and Finance Committee will continue to explore other solutions in the interim.

PASTORAL CARE

Together We Thrive – Fostering Self-Advocacy Through Mutual Support Planning for Peace of Mind: The Importance of Advanced Care Planning

"Preparing for Life's Transitions" is an article recently published by the Council on Aging of Ottawa. It explores the topic of 'Smart Aging,' emphasizing that as we age, we face numerous transitions, including changes in health and finances.

One key takeaway for me is that 'smart aging' challenges all age groups. Life transitions impact teenagers just as significantly as they do seniors. A common thread in all transitioning is decision-making – especially the decisions we make before a crisis is upon us. A crucial aspect of this process is learning when it is necessary to say 'no.'

The Tuesday ZOOM conversation group discussed this question, which is important to making smart decisions: When have you realized that saying 'no' to a new opportunity or experience was holding you back from something beneficial? What did that teach you about embracing change?"

will be in support of the Chipembi Congregation - our Global Partner in Zambia.

The Chipembi Congregation of the United Church of Zambia is located on a UCZ Mission Station in a small rural community northeast of the capital of Lusaka. Working in partnership with the other institutions on the Chipembi Mission Station, including the Chipembi Girls Secondary School, the Chipembi College of Agriculture, the Chipembi Rural Health Centre and the Chipembi Basic School, the Chipembi congregation responds to the needs of this vast rural community.

Emmanuel has been in partnership with the Chipembi Congregation since 2011. Both communities of faith share a common interest in, and a commitment to, Christian development and outreach to those in need. Emmanuel takes an active part in shared partnership projects that will aid in the spiritual and educational development of children and young people and in the development of healthy and sustainable families and communities.

One of the areas that our partnership has focussed on over the years is Camp Chipembi, a week-long Christian day camp program for over 100 children from the area, led by youth and young adults from both the Chipembi and Emmanuel congregations. As a global intercultural learning and faith formation space for children, youth and young adults, it also provides an opportunity for leadership development. Camp Chipembi has become one of the critical lenses for seeing, learning and understanding how we are living out God's mission in this partnership.

More recently, the partnership has entered into agreement on a project for infrastructure development and renovation of the Chipembi Rural Health Centre. Situated in a district which has a

population of approximately 19,000 people, it is the only clinic in the district. The facility is in great need of repairs and upgrades – the facility looks old because it was painted a long time ago, the ceilings are in dilapidated state and the floor tiles need replacing. The ability to respond to the needs of the patients is severely impacted by the existing conditions of the clinic. It is an example of how health conditions in rural Zambia are far below what is acceptable. Through the partnership many areas will be renovated, most areas will be painted and air conditioning units and solar panels will be installed.

While it is important that we look after ourselves in the work we do at Emmanuel, it is also important that we reach out to those in our world who are in need, particularly those with whom we have a partnership.

We hope that you will give consideration for a donation to this partnership through the Communion Offering on Sunday, October 6, 2024.
