

Food Bank Sunday and Monday


It's that time again. Time to think about donating to the Rideau Rockcliffe Community Resource Centre food bank. After Christmas, donations drop but the need does not.




You can drop off donations to the church on Monday, January 27th between 2:00 and 3:00 PM or at any time by placing them in the Food Bank Collection box in the narthex.


