Our Lay Reader today is Krista Schneider. Thank you for your part in our worship service this morning.


Thank you to the production team, ushers, lay reader and coffee hosts for bringing us today's worship service and coffee and conversation time.

FINANCE

The CRA has confirmed that the 2024 charitable donation deadline will be extended to February 28, 2025. This means that tax receipts for donations made between January 1, 2025 and February 28, 2025 may also be eligible to be claimed as charitable tax credits on 2024 Canadian income tax returns. The Finance Committee has decided not to issue tax receipts for all donations received between January 1 and February 28, 2025, but will do so upon individual request. Should you wish to claim donations made during the extension period on your 2024 Income Tax return please contact Keith Jeacle, Envelope Secretary at envelope.secretary@emmanuelunited.ca NOTE: Keith will be in Zambia from March 6 – 22, 2025 and will not be able to process your request during that time period.
