Updates from the Zambia Pilgrimage (March 6-22):

A groundbreaking ceremony for a girl's dormitory was held at the Chipembi Day school. The building of the dormitory has been supported through our Global Partnership and is needed so that young girls living far from the school have a place to stay.





Medical supplies were delivered to the Chipembi Rural Health Centre, and we toured the center and saw the addition that was built with our support that lets them do laboratory testing.

This is our meeting place on Makumba Farm where we have our debrief sessions, discuss our day, and pray together. Our spiritual leaders in addition to Rev. Grant and Rev. Lowes have been Mama Jenn, and Mama Rose, who both graduated from the Chipembi Girls school 60 years ago, and Mama Grace and Mwai Bula. They sing and pray with us. They listen in daily sessions as we share our thoughts on what we've seen, and we have been blessed with their understanding and guidance.





We visited the Chipembi Girls Secondary School alongside the new CEO of Schools. He had heard about the quality of the school and our partnership.

While in Chipembi for our final church service there were gifts given and received. A communion chalice and plate were presented to the United Church of Zambia, Chipembi Congregation on behalf of our United



Church of Canada Ottawa partnership group by Rev. Lowes and Rev. Stuckless.
