Scripture Sentences: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as long as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Invitation:

As Jesus was called to the cross, as we are called on our journey, at times, to difficult chapters and places, we go forth now remembering Jesus as he walked with his disciples to the Upper Room.

We remember together.

We are not alone.

Let us pray our Thanksgiving Prayers.

Thanksgiving Prayers:

Amid all these people, O God, we find you breaking through with life once more – ever the life,

ever the life

and also on the night you, as Christ, were betrayed amid the company of disciples we find you tearing the bread and lifting the cup promising the life

promising the life

and in the faithfulness of followers and the confusion of disciples are your words of remembering put back the broken pieces

put back the broken pieces

and so the bread is broken and the story starts of your brokenness and suffering and cross leading to life

leading to life

the cup of wine too: the blood and the covenant of the love of heaven opening up life

opening up life

so these symbols at the end of this meal are the start of a new way that speak about life

speak about life

inviting us to follow and walk your path into olive groves and rubbish dumps seeking out life

seeking out life

trusting you always through the darkness and the danger the betrayal and denial trusting in life **trusting in life.**

Holy, holy, holy,

God of power and might Heaven and earth are full of your glory Blessed is the one who bears your name Hosanna in the highest

and so we tell your wholly human story of giving and breaking of spilling and loving believing in life **believing in life** and in this bread and this wine the story continues bread set apart for this story only as you eat with your disciples and trust the impossible trusting love

trusting love.

This is the week: Jesus is betrayed when the darkness gathers and the world conspires. This is the week: Jesus gathers his friends and speaks of heaven. This is the week: Jesus breaks bread and speaks through it, "my body broken for you."

(The breaking of the bread).

This is the week: Jesus is given over when the lights go out and the world laughs. This is the week: Jesus shares with his friends a broken way and a kiss of betrayal.

(The lifting of the cup).

This is the week: Jesus takes the cup and invests it with the new covenant sealed in blood.

This is the week: Jesus breaks this bread – his body; and shares this cup – his life – with us.

This is our statement: an act that speaks into the world beyond words.
