

#### **COMMUNICATIONS**

VIDEO/AUDIO: Operations at the Video and Audio consoles continue to go well. We are, however, beginning to suffer from lacka-operator phobia. There are basically six people who share video and audio duties. Of those six; two are heading back to school and will likely be sporadic in availability, two are in the choir so have limited availability, leaving two stalwarts. If you have ANY interest in doing either video or audio, please let a member of the Communications Committee know. Adequate training will be provided: this usually consists of 1 week watching, 1 week being coached and the last week being watched. Not rocket science. Remember, no bodies, no streaming and no audio. And I DO know of at least one church that had to stop due to lack of operators!!

SLIDE PREPARERS: Every week a team of dedicated individuals prepares the slides you see on Sunday, in the Narthex and at special occasions such as funerals, etc. Many of the same people doing video streaming are also on this team and thus there are few weeks when they are not involved in some aspect of the service. We need people! All that is required is a computer and some knowledge of PowerPoint. Services tend to be of three types: standard, communion and special occasions. Most of the time the slide decks are simply modifications of previous decks, not requiring a lot of extra work beyond Hymns, Prayers, etc. If you are interested, PLEASE, let a member of the Communications Committee know. This is a team approach with checkers along the way, so it is quite difficult to make any major mistakes, and if you do, well so be it. We REALLY need some additional bodies for this.

#### Together we Thrive

Last spring, the Pastoral Care Team launched a seniors' lunch and learn group called *Transitions*. The group was created in recognition of the many changes that come with aging—some anticipated, others unexpected—that can significantly impact our daily routines, relationships, health, and sense of purpose.

Navigating these transitions can be challenging, but having a strong support network—whether through family, friends, community groups, or professional services—can make a meaningful difference. By thinking proactively about potential challenges, we can often avoid preventable crises and maintain a greater sense of stability and well-being.

## A Quantum Meditation - Entangled in Love

"I am connected in ways I cannot see but can always feel."

In quantum physics, there's a remarkable idea called **entanglement**: when two particles become connected, they stay linked—even when they're far apart. What happens to one still affects the other.

It's a mystery, yes—but it's also a powerful spiritual image. We, too, are never truly separate.

God created us for relationship—not only with each other but with God's own self. Scripture reminds us, "In God we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28).
