



Together we Thrive

As a church family, we walk together through every season of life — in times of joy and in times of sorrow. Our faith reminds us that even in our deepest struggles, we are never alone, the light of Christ shines through the care, prayers, and presence of our community. As we approach Advent and the Christmas season, when hearts may feel heavy and memories tender, we come together to lift one another up in love, hope, and faith.

From Loss to Light Service ~ Sunday December 14th at 2 PM

This service is a time to remember our losses. There have been a lot this year, including death, illness, divorce, job loss and separation from loved ones for many reasons. It is also to hear words of support and hope. If you are having trouble finding peace this season, this time of prayer and reflection may provide the solace you are yearning for. We are not alone. God is with us!

Quantum Meditation for November:

The Threshold of Presence About Quantum Meditations

Quantum meditations are short reflections that draw on the language and imagination of modern physics to deepen our spiritual life. These aren't about science, but about wonder — how faith and mystery help us find meaning in everyday change.

November is a month of thresholds — a time when the visible world thins, when trees let go of what they no longer need, and the earth settles into rest. In the Christian calendar, it's a season of remembrance and quiet hope: All Saints, All Souls, and the slow approach of Advent.

Quantum physics reminds us that what disappears isn't really gone. Every particle continues in another form — energy changing, presence lasting in ways we can't always see. The universe itself is a web of relationships, where nothing is ever truly separate or lost.

John O'Donohue once wrote, "The invisible embraces everything. It holds the night and the day, the dark and the light, sorrow and celebration." In this season of fading light, we can trust that what we

love is still held in that invisible embrace — that the mystery of life is bigger than what we see.

The saints, the departed, the ones we carry in our hearts — they remain part of us, part of the great circle of belonging. In quiet moments, we may even sense their nearness. Here, loss becomes love remembered, and endings open into something deeper and unseen.

Meditation Question:

When you think of someone you've loved and lost, how do you still feel their presence in your life? Let yourself pause there. Sit with that feeling, that trace of them that still lives in you. Notice what rises—warmth, ache, gratitude—and let it be what it is.
