“I tell you that whosoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will never enter into it.” (Luke 18:17)



COMMUNICATIONS

Another year has come and gone, and we begin again.

VIDEO/AUDIO: Operations at the Video and Audio consoles continue to go well.

It should be noted that we came within ONE volunteer, who happened to also be in the choir, of NOT streaming the 5:00 pm Christmas Eve service !!

There are basically 6 people who share video and audio duties. Of those 6; 2 are heading back to school and will likely be sporadic in

availability, 2 are in the choir so have limited availability, leaving 2 stalwarts.

If you have **ANY** interest in doing either video or audio, please let a member of the Communications Committee know. Adequate training will be provided: this usually consists of 1 week watching, 1 week being coached and the last week being watched. Not rocket science. Remember, no bodies, no streaming and no audio. And I **DO** know of at least one church that had to stop due to lack of operators!!

SLIDE PREPARERS: Every week a team of dedicated individuals prepares the slides you see on Sunday, in the Narthex and at special occasions such as funerals, etc. Many of the same people doing video streaming are also on this team and thus there are few weeks when they are not involved in some aspect of the service.

We need people! All that is required is a computer and some knowledge of PowerPoint. Services tend to be of three types: standard, communion and special occasions. Most of the time the slide decks are simply modifications of previous decks, not requiring a lot of extra work beyond Hymns, Prayers, etc. If you are interested, **PLEASE**, let a member of the Communications Committee know. This is a team approach with checkers along the way, so it is quite difficult to make any major mistakes, and if you do, well so be it. We **REALLY** need some additional bodies for this.

ADVERTISING: The Communications Committee has embarked on an advertising blitz for 2026, to see if we can generate interest in Emmanuel. We expect there to be some type of ad in every issue of at least one of the local papers, plus the usual Activity blurb.

PLEASE also provide the information to Val Dowd for posting on the EUC website.


