Lighting of the Advent Candles

Reader1:

With each candle we light, we proclaim that the light of Christ is stronger than the shadows, and the life He brings is everlasting.

(Light the first and second candles)

Reader2:

Today we light the third candle of Advent, the candle of Joy.

It shines with warmth and celebration, like the first light of morning after a long night.

Christ's light brings joy — joy that rises above sorrow.

(Light the third candle, the pink candle.)

God of joy, make our hearts light. Let us feel the joy of your light as we rejoice in your coming. Help us share that joy with others. Amen.
